The newly-established Institute for Sustainable Energy at Boston University seeks a limited number of post-doctoral fellows for its inaugural academic year of 2016-17. The Institute is a university-wide nexus for research, education, and policy engagement in all areas of sustainable energy and climate policy, with particular emphasis on sustainable cities, climate policy, and the transformation of the electric power sector

The main tasks of the Fellows will be to stimulate interdisciplinary research and communication among Boston University faculty and the Institute's stakeholders in academia, business, government, and nongovernmental organizations. Prospective candidates should note that the Institute is strongly oriented towards applied research and engagement with industry and policymakers; applicants should have a passion for multidisciplinary, policy-centered work.

Fellows are appointed for one year, beginning 1 September 2016. Applicants must have a PhD. The specific focus and departmental affiliation of Fellows will vary based on their match to the Institute's initial projects as well as their research backgrounds and interests. Doctoral degrees in economics, finance, engineering, environmentally-focused natural sciences, business, public policy, and others are relevant to the work of the Institute.

Applicants should submit a letter of motivation, their CV including a publication list, and a description of their own research plans (max. 1000 words) to Ms. Jessica Hogan, hoganjl@bu.edu. Applicants are required to supply the names of three individuals who can be contacted to supply letters of reference. This posting remains open until the positions are filled.
